

# 2006-07 Central Coast Fencing Circuit Cup

Sponsored by the Central Coast Fencing Foundation

General Participation Award	Every participant in the series will receive a prize award.
Highest Attendance Award	Fencers with the highest attendance will receive a prize award and a ribbon.
Highest Competitive Award	The top three fencers in each age category will receive a prize award and a medal. Age categories include Youth-10, Youth-12, Youth-14, Cadet and Junior.

## I. General Rules

- I-1. The Central Coast Fencing Cup (CCFC) will consist of three to five Youth/Cadet/Junior competitions scheduled for the fencing season.
- I-2. The fencing season lasts from August thru July of the following year.
- I-3. All competitions will be held on the central coast of California. As sponsor of the circuit championship, the CCFF will determine which events will be included.
- I-4. At the end of the season, all fencers that participated in a Cup event will receive a prize. In addition, the fencers who participated in the most number of Cup events will be awarded an Attendance prize and ribbon. Attendance Points are described below.
- I-5. Competitive prizes will also be given to the top three fencers in each age category according to the sum of the points earned at the Cup events. Competition Points are described below.

## II. Eligibility

- II-1. USFA membership is NOT required. Any fencer whether registered as a USFA member or not is eligible to compete in the CCFFC so long as they meet age requirements.
- II-2. Age requirements shall correspond to recognized USFA age requirements. However, no age overlaps will be allowed.

- II-3. Fencers that have been ejected (“black carded) from any Cup event will be disqualified from receiving Attendance and Competitive awards in the current fencing season. Fencers may submit a written appeal of this decision to the CCFB Board.

### III. Format

- III-1. All events will use the foil. Cadet and Junior events may be run as electric or a combination of standard and electric rounds. Youth events may be run as electric, or a combination thereof, provided the host organizer can supply all needed electric fencing gear.

### IV. Scoring

- IV-1. For every circuit competition the fencer participates in, they will receive one Attendance Point. Should the fencer participate in multiple events of the same competition, only one Attendance Point shall be awarded.
- IV-2. The Attendance Award will go to the fencer or fencers with the highest number of points. If there are four competitions in the circuit then a maximum score would be 4 Attendance Points.
- IV-3. Competitive Award scoring for the circuit championship will be based upon Competitive Points earned at each of the circuit competitions.
- IV-4. Competitive Points will be based on a modified Olympics point system:

1st	64 points	10th	10 points
2nd	48 points	11th	9 points
3rd	32 points*	12th	8 points
4th	28 points	13th	7 points
5th	20 points	14th	6 points
6th	18 points	15th	5 points
7th	16 points	16th	4 points
8th	14 points	17th thru 32 <sup>nd</sup>	2 points
9th	11 points	33 <sup>rd</sup> thru 64 <sup>th</sup>	1 point

- IV-5. Should a competition not fence off for third place, then the third place fencers will receive an equal portion of the points for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place (or 30 points).
- IV-6. Depending on the number of fencers in the specific age for the competition, a factor will be multiplied against the fencer’s competitive placement points to arrive at a total competitive points score for the fencer. The following is a table of competition factors:

### **Competition Factor**

7 or less fencers	competition factor = 1
8 – 13 fencers	competition factor = 1.2
14 – 20 fencers	competition factor = 1.5
21 – 32 fencers	competition factor = 1.8
Greater than 32 fencers	competition factor = 2

IV-7. If two or more age groups are combined, the results of the competition shall be broken out by each age category for determining competitive points.

### **V. Fees & Registration**

- V-1. Every fencer participating in the Cup events must complete a registration form. The purpose of the registration form is provide the CCFE with the ability to send the fencer information about upcoming Cup events and to mail awards and prizes to the fencers as necessary.
- V-2. There is a \$10 registration fee for the Cup this year.
